SUMMARY

THE DISTRICT 2 LUNCHEON WAS EFFECTIVELY A ROUNDTABLE WHERE COMMISSIONER GLASSMAN SPOKE ABOUT VARIOUS ISSUES OF INTEREST TO THE ASSOCIATIONS, OTHER CITY OFFICIALS SPOKE OF SIMILAR ISSUES AND HOMEOWNER'S ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVES WERE AFFORDED THE OPPORTUNITY TO BRIEFLY DISCUSS THE STATE OF AFFAIRS IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOODS AS WELL AS ADDRESS ANY CONCERNS.

OF THE ISSUES DISCUSSED, THE MOST RELEVANT WAS A DISCUSSION OF THE RECENTLY PASSED PARKS BOND. THE NEW CITY MANAGER, CHRIS LAGERBLOOM, INDICATED THAT THE \$200 MILLION BOND AND ITS APPLICATION WILL BE DISCUSSED OVER THE NEXT SEVERAL YEARS AND INPUT IS BEING SOLICITED FROM ALL NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS. THERE ARE INITIAL PLANS FOR WORK TO FOUR "SIGNATURE" PARKS BEING HOLIDAY PARK, CARTER PARK, LOCKHART STADIUM AND THE PROPOSED TUNNEL TOP PARK. MR. LAGERBLOOM WOULD LIKE IDEAS AND PROPOSALS RELATIVE TO NEW LAND ACQUISITION, NEW FACILITIES AND UPGRADES TO EXISTING FACILITIES.

INPUT FROM DIHA INCLUDED A REPORT REGARDING THE PREVIOUS ISSUES WITH THE COMMERCIAL PARKING IN THE RIGHT-OF-WAY BEHIND SHORE CLUB. BASED ON MY OBSERVATIONS, THIS PROBLEM HAS BEEN MUCH LESS NOTICEABLE OVER THE PAST SEVERAL MONTHS SINCE MEETING WITH

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PARKING ENFORCEMENT. ISSUES WITH THE ENTRY FEATURE. WATER SERVICE WATER/ELECTRIC AND SEVERAL POTHOLES MENTIONED BY DIHA MEMBERS WERE ADDRESSED. COMMISSIONER GLASSMAN STATED THAT PICTURES AND LOCATIONS OF ANY POTHOLES SHOULD BE E-MAILED TO HIS ASSISTANT, PRATIMA RAJU, PRAJU@FORTLAUDERDALE.GOV .
